BETTER RESULTS

If you went to Home Depot and bought a can of paint, went home and popped the lid off, dipped in the paintbrush, and just started painting you likely wouldn't be very satisfied with the result. After that experience you might decide to read the label. There you would find that certain preparations were needed for a good outcome. By not making preparations, more work has resulted and now you have to correct the situation because of being impetuous. This analogy can be applied to us. If you get the bike out, start it up and just ride off you could end up with an unsatisfactory result. "I'm only going a short distance so I don't need the helmet, jacket, gloves or other protective apparel." While rectifying the bad result with the paint is bothersome and annoying, the "short distance" ride can be painful. Then comes the cry; "why did I do that?" If it's a short trip to the pharmacy or grocery store, take the car. If you are in a hurry to get somewhere, don't take the bike.

As motorcyclists we observe other motorcyclist on the road. In doing so we evaluate what those riders are doing and/or what is being worn. Recently I observed two riders on sport bikes riding side by side in dense Interstate traffic. Riding side by side isn't prohibited but it's not wise. They had helmets and gloves but not armored motorcycle jackets. The most dangerous was they were no more than 10-12 feet from the car in front of them. All sorts of catastrophic scenarios come to mind. They can't see anything beyond the car in front and a driver tapping the brake three cars ahead can produce a lock up situation. By observing poor riding habits in others we can reinforce our own good riding habits. Our good riding habits are like reading the label, following instructions and making preparations so we can enjoy better results.




Retread's Marketplace


