Roger Deevers reminded us that it is getting "hotter" which means we need to keep hydrated. Bring water with you and drink lots of fluids to keep yourself hydrated. Also avoid being next to Semi-trucks. Those recapped steel belted tires can be deadly. They have about 110PSI and when they blow it is not something you want to be nearby. Watch out for the tire debris on the highways too. Another item Roger mentioned was <u>rain</u> that wet stuff that has been in short supply this last year. Be careful if you get caught in a storm, the roads are slick and vehicle drivers sometimes like to splash anybody/anything on the road. Lastly, we discussed how to be a good passenger. Follow your drivers lead – if they lean right, you lean right. Try to stay in line with them (be one, like synchronized swimmers). You can look over the drivers shoulder to see what might be coming up ahead on the road.

Jim Rohlman suggested for next year when we all get back in the winter that we see about "Riders to the rescue" organization. They hold educational classes to help us prepare in case of emergencies on the road. Several members indicated it is important to have at a minimum: your identification (driver's license), insurance card, cell phone and any/all medications at all times when you are on the motorcycle.

### **HELMET DATA**

This helmet has a graphic illustrating, from data collected over years and years of motorcycle accidents, the impact likelihood percentages for different parts of the helmet.



The data used to make the graphic comes from this study on motorcycle crashes: https://smf.org/docs/articles/hic/Helmeted\_MC\_JTrauma.pdf

Now, with the above in mind, what bits are missing from a 3/4 helmet?

The chin bar - responsible for the majority of the crash impact locations.

A half helmet? add in the back of the head and the base of the skull, easily represented by higher percentages than the parts of the head actually covered by the half helmet.

And those tiny skullcap helmets? the ones that exist solely to appease the DOT standards for helmet-mandated states? such helmets would protect in only 3.6% of crashes according to the study. The other 96.4% of unfortunate downed riders would take the hit on an unprotected part of their head or face.

The only way to ensure that a helmet takes the hit in 100% of crashes? Wear a helmet that covers 100% of the head.

The rest of your body is in need of protection as well. But as has been stated before, how safe you want to be is a personal choice.

Ride safe.

#### April 17<sup>th</sup> Pot Luck Lunch


