Expecting the Unexpected



When someone else fails to do his or her job properly it can cause a hazard. Recently a lady I was talking to related her experience when she was following a disabled trash truck being towed in for repairs. Seems the trash truck had it's drive shaft break and the tow truck driver didn't secure the drive shaft which remained under the vehicle. She, following behind in her Porsche Boxster, fell victim to the drive shaft falling completely off of the trash truck and she was unable to avoid hitting it. Almost any vehicle would have sustained some damage. The sports car endured damage to the steering, undercarriage and engine. She went on to say that she was thankful that she was in her car and not riding her Honda Shadow motorcycle. Her car did get fixed but, as she stated, had she been on the bike things might have been disastrous. Therein lies the lesson for us: Expect the unexpected. Giving more space to a vehicle in front provides opportunity for avoidance. If another vehicle moves into the space, that one can run over the drive shaft and not you.

Tire debris is a constant problem on our highways all over the country but more so here in Arizona. Semi tires can actually explode. We have all seen heavy pieces of tread and particles of the carcass on and along side of the road. Keep in mind that most of those tires are steel belted and shards of metal are in some of those pieces. If you see some pieces of a tire expect to see more and be prepared to take evasive action. It can't be emphasized enough how important it is to discipline yourself to always do a head check when merging or changing lanes. Also check right and left when proceeding through an intersection even though you know you have the right of way. Most collisions with autos and motorcycles occur at intersections. Ride safe.

The motorcycle ride will continue through Colorado, visiting Eagle and Fort Collins, and make its way through the Black Hills in South Dakota. On August 4, members of the Veterans Charity Ride will experience a "Hero's Welcome" upon their arrival to the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. The journey not only delivers the freedom of the open road and cathartic experience only a motorcycle can deliver, but allows the veterans to bond by sharing stories and engage in peer-to-peer discussions.

"Veterans Charity Ride is a life-changing program for those who have sacrificed so much for our country," said Reid Wilson, Senior Director – Marketing and Product Planning for Indian Motorcycle. 


