SIGHTS AND SOUNDS

What we call fun and liberating might be frightening and repulsive to others who don't have our perspective. Some of those who reject out interest might like jumping off of the high dive at the swimming pool when perhaps we wouldn't. Isn't being whisked along on our bikes, and in some cases trikes, feeling the openness a wonderful adventure that just can't be had in an enclosed vehicle? Jumping off of the high dive into the water is too brief for us. Plus traveling down the open road and even negotiating traffic is a more lasting experience. All of that openness exposes us to things that aren't noticed in an enclosed vehicle. I recall the first time I heard a vehicle go over a cattle guard when on the bike. That was startling to say the least. All the things that are visible to us but previously ignored are now quick glances to take notice of and to be enjoyed. Even odors that were previously unnoticed are detected. To add some humor to the subject, we can enjoy the full benefit of diesel exhaust and decaying road kill.

Heightened awareness to sights and sounds should help keep us safe on our journeys. The key word there is "should." Absolutely safe is simply not achievable. Watching for what can reach out and grab us reduces the risks. Trucks or trailers piled high with anything and everything merit extra scrutiny. When pieces of tires appear, expect to see more and perhaps larger chunks, maybe even the whole tread. When approaching an intersection be ready to apply the brakes. Never assume, because you have the green light that you can whiz through an intersection oblivious. As always, that most important head check when merging and changing lanes simply must be in you habit pattern. While we can never be absolutely safe, paying attention to sights and sounds "should" yield a fun and liberating riding experience.






