Roger Deevers gave us the method to identify your tires age (WWYY). WW is the week of the tire manufacture with YY being the year. As an example, 1219 = 12th week of the 2019 year. He also spoke about 2 articles that were given to him about safety. First article was "riding too close" and the other was "helmet brake" light. Both articles were from the BMW owner's magazine. Lastly, he spoke about protection. Begins with your helmet, ending with your apparel. Helmets that contain the DOT (department of transportation) and SNELL rating provide a helmet that has met specific industry criteria. SNELL was named for a race car driver William "Pete" Snell. SNELL is a rating where DOT is a certification. Certifications hold the manufacture liable for their claims where a rating has no liability claim. Roger also thanked all the Retreads who attended the Car show at Andrada Polytechnic high school. Roger volunteers in the automotive area – assisting with the students in all aspects of their automotive education.

4 Corners Rally - Judy updated us with the new location Payson, Utah for July 14-17, 2022. She hopes all will attend.

SAFETY CONCERNS

CONSTANT VIGILANCE



THIN SKIN

Many of you may be wearing leather jackets and perhaps chaps. Expensive, yes, but there's evidence that these provide more than mere protection from the cold.

In studies of 'survivability' of various garment materials to a 50 MPH ride on asphalt, for example, denim lasted no more than FOUR FEET before wearing through. Kevlar, on the other hand, lasted EIGHTEEN FEET. But standard motorcycle quality leather (about three times heavier than fashion jacket material) lasted EIGHTY-SIX FEET. That's more than 20 times as effective as your jeans in protecting your hide. [The tests were reported in the September 1988 issue of Cycle magazine.]

50 MPH may seem rather fast for a typical "go down" but 30 to 40 might be more common. Just 15 or 20 MPH would chew up unprotected flesh rather efficiently. Too hot? Other than leather there's many vented and mesh armored jackets available which are comfortable in temperatures even over 100 degrees. How about gloves? You don't feel with the palm of your hand. Why neglect the most sensitive part, your finger tips? Gloves also come in armored designs. Everything designed for the protection of the rider works. Take advantage of it.

We'll be getting warmer temperatures soon and with the low humidity we have in Arizona dehydration is a probability. Be sure to always have water. Check tire pressure often. Properly inflated tires run cooler and last longer, not to mention the handling characteristics of the bike. Tire pressures should be checked in the morning when they are cold before departing on your ride.

Remember, it's all about you and your co-rider if you have one. How safe we want to be is up to us as individuals. Often seen are riders who want to project an image more than personal protection. So please be safe and ride safe.
